CADA Announces Dead Man Winter Concert at Mankato Brewery

(MANKATO, MN) – The Committee Against Domestic Abuse (CADA) is hosting the national-recording act Dead Man Winter, featuring Mankato-native Dave Simonett of Trampled by Turtles, at the Mankato Brewery on Saturday, November 18, 2017. Opening for the band, is The Hootenanny Annies.

The performance is a celebration of the local bars who have received training and certification through CADA’s Safe Bar Initiative Program, a prevention effort to help reduce sexual harassment and violence in local bars.

“We’re really excited about celebrating local Safe Bars, while also educating event-goers on the steps they can take to be a part of the community-wide solution to end these forms of violence,” said Jason Mack, Executive Director at CADA.

Official ticket sales and purchase information for the 21-plus event will be released October 1st at 12 p.m. and will be available online and at the Mankato Brewery. The \$10 fee covers admission for both bands, food from Pub 500, and access to prizes, as well as education ways people can prevent violence in their communities.
