"The first time you do the impossible, it takes a little longer." - SM Kelly If I had created a list of the characteristics of a perfect situation to be in at this stage of my work life, it would have a picture of CADA right next to it. By the end of CADA's Fiscal Year 2014, we had laid the foundation for what promises to be a marvelous positive impact on conversations about domestic and sexual violence in our region and beyond, we had started restoring faltering or broken bridges, and we had erected the frameworks to carry an organization **whose time has come** into the next phase of existence. By the end of CADA's Fiscal Year 2015, we were on the way to establishing ourselves as an access point for expert commentary on issues related to domestic and sexual violence, human trafficking and the victimization associated with children witnessing interparental violence. It is safe to say that CADA is on the map in our region and we'll be here for a while.

The interesting thing is we've always been here, but the average person doesn't know it. With an informal rebranding campaign to get "CADA" and all it can do into the minds and lexicon of the community, CADA introduced CADAkids, CADAcorps, CADdance and all things CADA into the minds and hearts of systems practitioners while properly enshrining the important work of "CADA House." We have graduated from the little safe house with no address and ten beds to annual service numbers of close to 2500, five satellite offices and a bustling education and training schedule that has the community buzzing. CADA's staff is nothing short of amazing, we hope you come often to our events.

Program highlights in 2014

2,025 primary and 341 secondary survivors of domestic violence were served through our Outreach programs * 269 primary and 114 secondary sexual violence victims were served through our Outreach programs * 275 victims of domestic violence were assisted in obtaining Orders For Protection * 106 victims of domestic violence were assisted in obtaining Harassment Restraining Orders * 33 victims of sexual violence were assisted in obtaining Orders For Protection * 21 victims of sexual violence were assisted in obtaining Harassment Restraining Orders * 104 women and 165 children were provided with emergency safety shelter * 79 children were able to visit with their non-custodial parents through the Keep Me Safe Parenting Time Center * 71 community presentations were facilitated by CADA with 1,904 participants in attendance * 886.5 hours of volunteering/interning helped us meet our mission * Survivors of domestic and sexual violence accessed therapeutic counseling 271 times.

Program highlights in 2015

1,280 primary and 394 secondary survivors of domestic violence were served through our Outreach programs * 208 primary and 94 secondary sexual violence victims were served through our Outreach programs * 349 victims of domestic violence were assisted in obtaining Orders For Protection * 153 victims of domestic violence were assisted in obtaining Harassment Restraining Orders * 26 victims of sexual violence were assisted in obtaining Orders For Protection * 15 victims of sexual violence were assisted in obtaining Harassment Restraining Orders* 108 women and 172 children were provided with emergency safety shelter * 65 children were able to visit with their non-custodial parents through the Keep Me Safe Parenting Time Center * 176 community presentations were facilitated by CADA with 6,449 participants in attendance * 886.5 hours of volunteering/interning helped us meet our mission * Survivors of domestic and sexual violence accessed therapeutic counseling 346 times.

Message from the CADA Board Chair

On behalf of the Committee Against Domestic Abuse (CADA) organization staff and the board members, we give thanks for all those who have supported CADA over the past years. People have helped CADA in numerous ways by promoting, raising funds, or given of their time to serve and learn about CADA and its mission and goals. The region and people we serve has been a strength in 2014 by stepping up and helping CADA thrive and expand as we move toward a greater future.

During 2014 and 2015 many initiatives have begun and services within CADA have been fortified. I would like to comment on just a few in my message to our stakeholders.

- CADA hired a new Executive Director, Renita Robinson, who is extremely knowledgeable in
 domestic/sexual violence issues, is focused on education as a way of combating these issues, is
 aggressive in making our communities aware of these issues, is an ambassador for CADA in
 numerous ways, and is full of energy and enthusiasm.
- CADA has begun to earnestly bring awareness to our communities of the issues relating to
 domestic/sexual violence, human trafficking, and victims concerns. Bringing CADA into
 public awareness through educational workshops and forums has been one of the many goals
 of our executive director.
- CADA has been the recipient of many fundraising activities which have risen out of other
 groups and organizations in the past two years. This continues to be both a source of income
 as well as a pride in community concern as we head into 2016.
- CADAkids has been established to work with and help children who are observers or a part of
 violence. Through CADAkids sponsorship of a child involved in violence, CADA can help to
 give perspective to individual children who are victims.
- CADA has begun to recruit more volunteers to assist with services and those numbers have begun to increase over 2015.
- CADA revised their web site in 2014 and this has assisted in getting out vital information to
 those who are in search of services or educational opportunities and numerous other pieces of
 information about CADA and all its initiatives.
- CADA's shelter has been busy in 2015 housing people involved in violence. The shelter has gone through several changes this past year to include a computer lab for guests in the shelter, a playhouse in the playground and a new management structure for the shelter.
- All board members attended a seven hour training session at the conclusion of 2014 to orient new board members as well as the seasoned members on the structure of CADA, its services, and strategic planning for the organization in the future.

All in all 2014 and 2015 has brought many changes for CADA both in leadership as well as structure, an educational component for the communities we serve, an expansion of services provided as well as an expansion of the volunteers within the organization. Lastly, I would like to thank again all our contributors and ask for their sustained efforts as we continue to march forward in 2016.
