What is Keep Me Safe?

Families come to CADAs Keep Me Safe (KMS) Centers to have a neutral and safe place for children to visit their non-custodial caregivers in a positive, healthy, and nurturing environment. KMS is a place where children and their caregivers can be assured that parenting time and exchanges of children will be supervised and conflict-free.

You will be:

- Observing caregiver and child interactions during visits and exchanges
- Ensuring safety by intervening as needed to uphold policies during a visit or exchange
- Documenting observations and interventions of the visit
- Meeting regularly with the KMS team to process cases, brainstorm, and get support
